Open Floor

- Morning drop off on Boswell (Traci Wilson)
 - Send out a reminder to parents for how South Knoll would like parents to use Boswell during drop off. There is the school drop off lane, and then there is Boswell, where many parents with older kids "drop and go" which works well -no need for assistance in opening doors, getting out of car seats, etc.
 - But recently more and more vehicles are using Boswell in a similar way to the school lane -- driver exiting vehicle to help child unbuckle, gather backpack/lunch, hug, wave and watch as the child walks to Mrs. Rodriguez and crosses the school lane. This non-drop-n-go has been backing up the quick drop off option, and other drivers are getting antsy.
 - It has further progressed in that multiple days drivers have parked their car in the Boswell driving lane closest to the street parking in front of the school, left their flashers on, and exited the vehicle entirely to walk a child inside, leaving an empty vehicle in the middle of the road. Honking and a traffic jam ensues, and again antsy drivers turning frustrated and not always paying attention to people crossing the street (not at a crosswalk).
 - There are also quite a few cars that semi-park in the far parking lane, just in front
 of the houses on Boswell. I say "semi" because some are sticking out in the left
 Boswell driving lane, others are parked such that those who came before them
 can't get out.
 - It's getting a little chaotic, and it might be time for a refresher of how SK would like us to use each lane.
